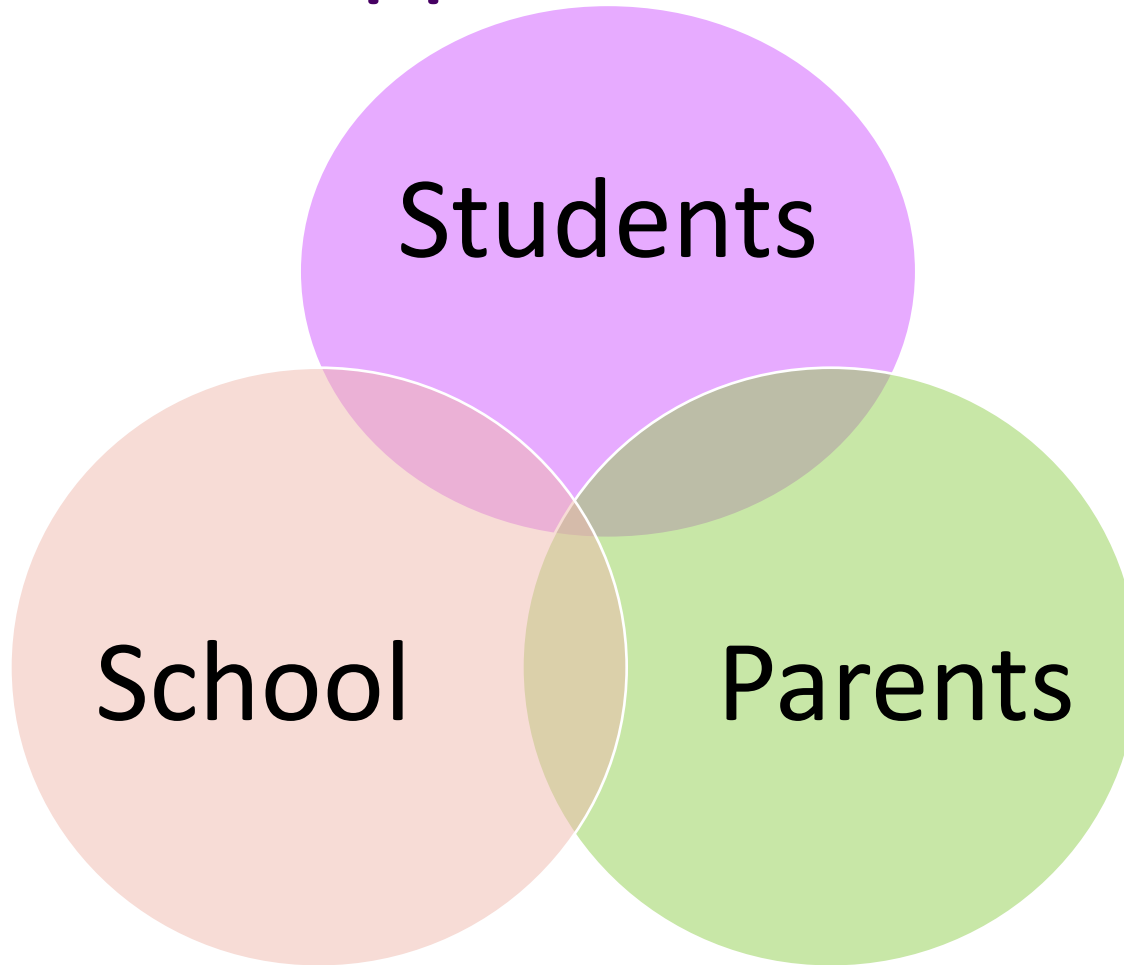

GCSE Countdown

- **38 weeks completed or 3 terms**
- **26 weeks left until GCSEs**

Attendance

- Your child's attendance should be 100%
- The link between attendance and academic success is clear.
- Students with high attendance gain on average half a grade more in their GCSEs.





The new research shows that overall absence had a negative link to attainment, with every extra day missed associated with a lower chance of achieving 5 or more good GCSEs or equivalent at grades A* to C including in English and mathematics, or gaining the gold standard English Baccalaureate (EBacc).

The higher the percentage of sessions missed across the key stage, the lower the likely level of attainment at the end of KS4. Specifically, pupils with no absence are 1.5 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs A*-C or equivalent and 2.8 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs A*-C than pupils missing 15-20 per cent of KS4 lessons.

Expectations of GCSEs

Revision

- Don't work late at night
- Put away distractions – especially mobile phones, laptops, X-boxes etc.....
- Healthy living works – plenty of sleep, eat properly and drink plenty of water
- Use school staff for help and advice!
